ADORATION

Pastor: Rend your hearts and not your garments. Return to the LORD, your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and relents over disaster. *Joel 2:12-14*

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM Part 1

Pastor: What is Baptism?

People: Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God's command and combined with God's Word.

Pastor: Which is that Word of God?

People: Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Matthew 28:19

Baptized in water, sealed by the Spirit, cleansed by the blood of Christ, our King; heirs of salvation, trusting his promise, faithfully now God's praises we sing.

EPISTLE 1 Peter 3:18-21

For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God. He was put to death in the body but made alive in the Spirit. After being made alive, he went and made proclamation to the imprisoned spirits— to those who were disobedient long ago when God waited patiently in the days of Noah while the ark was being built. In it only a few people, eight in all, were saved through water, and this water symbolizes baptism that now saves you also—not the removal of dirt from the body but the pledge of a clear conscience toward God. It saves you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ,

SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM Part 2

Pastor: What benefits does Baptism give?

People: It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.

Pastor: Which are these words and promises of God?

People: Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Mark:
"Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but
whoever does not believe will be condemned."

SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM *Part 3*

Pastor: How can water do such great things?

People: Certainly not just water, but the Word of God in and with the water does these things, along with the faith which trusts this Word of God in the water. For

without God's Word the water is plain water and no Baptism. But with the Word of God it is a Baptism, that is, a life-giving water, rich in grace, and a washing of new birth in the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul says in Titus, chapter three: "He saved us not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to His own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by His grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life. The saying is trustworthy." Titus 3:5-8

SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM Part 4

Pastor: What does such baptizing with water indicate?

People: It indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

Pastor: Where is this written?

People: St Paul writes in Romans, chapter six: "We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." Romans 6:4
