Advent 2: The Song of Mary December 9, 2015

As We Gather

Mary, a virgin betrothed to Joseph, would receive an angelic visitation that would move her by God's Spirit to erupt in praise to God. So we continue to celebrate these ancient "songs" of Holy Scripture that share with us the good news of Jesus' birth. Tonight we join with Mary in singing a melody of remembrance for all the ways the Lord has remembered His covenant with us through His Son. Let the words, Scripture verses, hymns, litanies and prayers of our worship serve as music to your soul as you personally hearken to the glad sound of Jesus' birth.

Order of Service

Welcome and Hymn Sing

Opening Hymn "Hark the Glad Sound" (special lyrics, sung to tune: LSB #349)

Hark the glad sound! The Savior comes, the Savior promised long; Let ev'ry heart prepare a throne and ev'ry voice a song.

Come, magnify his holy name, the God of Abraham; For as a sacrifice for sin, the Lord provides the Lamb.

Litany

Pastor: O God, we love Mary's melody of remembrance—

People: recalling God's gracious covenant promises to Abraham and his seed forever.

Pastor: Her voice is joyful as she remembers how magnificent God is to her;

People: our voices also express our wonder at his goodness.

Pastor: God will lift her up, and she is overwhelmed with joy. We join her in her words of praise:

People: "My soul now magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked on the humble estate of his servant. For behold, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for he who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name."

Lighting of the Advent Wreath

Pastor: Let us light two candles. The first candle is the candle of repentance.

People: The second is the candle of remembrance, for we know how much we have forgotten.

(The first and second candles of the Advent Wreath are lit at this time.)

Pastor: With one voice we join Mary's song, remembering:

People: "His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts; he has brought down the mighty from their thrones and exalted those of humble estate; he has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty."

Confession and Absolution

Pastor: Mary was aware of her "humble estate." She knew she was unworthy of the Lord's gift to her. Our awareness is really no different. We remember our "humble estate." We regularly acknowledge our unworthiness through confessing our sins:

People: Almighty God, I confess to you all of the sins by which I have offended you. I deserve to suffer for my sins, both now and in eternity. I am sorry for my sins and I pray that you will look on me in mercy and forgive me for the sake of Jesus my Savior, who suffered the punishment for my sins when he died on the cross.

Pastor: Mary remembered the mercy of the God for Abraham and for his seed forever. We too remember the tender mercy of our God as his covenant people, the children of Abraham. So with confidence I announce unto you that your sins are forgiven, in the name of the Father and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen. With Mary we remember and say: "He has helped his servant Israel in remembrance of his mercy, as he spoke to our fathers, to Abraham and to his offspring forever."

Prayer of the Day

Grant that we too may worship and adore him, and carry the message of your Son, our Lord, to all people. In Jesus' holy name we pray.

People: Amen.

Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. And I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and him who dishonors you I will curse, and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

Epistle Reading: Galatians 3:23-29

Now before faith came, we were held captive under the law, imprisoned until the coming faith would be revealed. So then, the law was our guardian until Christ came, in order that we might be justified by faith. But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian, for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to promise.
