Sharing God's Bounty

Each household has its own routine. We go to work; we help the kids with their homework and attend their events; we make the meals, clean the house, and do the laundry. Our days are full – sometimes too full. So full that time for the Lord is abbreviated or omitted altogether. Then comes Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. It's just what we need to get back on track. We gather together for worship. We hear again about Jesus' ministry, about the events that eventually lead up to his crucifixion, about his zeal for the Lord's house. We hear his prayer for his disciples and his words of comfort and preparation to them.

Our hearts are turned to Christ instead of toward ourselves. We ask for grace to love and serve as he did, sacrificing self for the good of others. "Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). Paul comments, "Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous man, though for a good man someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners Christ died for us" (Romans 5:7-8). God loved and chose us, the unlovely, to shed his grace upon. We are reminded that, "since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another" (1 John 4:11).

"Love one another." Not just our close friends or those who agree with us, but "one another." We can't do it, can we? Some people are just too hard to love. Some people are not deserving of our gifts and our attention. Some people aren't interested in the love we have to offer. The command remains: "Love one another."

Now is a good time to read John 15. Here we find the secret of loving and serving. Here we find the source of love, of faith, of everything we need. That source is Jesus. He is the Vine. He sustains and nurtures us, the branches. He enables us to bear fruit, to "love one another." He calls those who obey him. His friends and tells us he will give us whatever we ask in his name. So we pray, Lord, let us "love one another."

Too often we fail to understand that Christian instruction about money is one of the best opportunities we have to teach our children about God's love for us, and his ownership of all things. The way we use money is the extension of our personal characteristics. By teaching our children the Christian use of money, affording them control of money and the need to make decisions about money, we also confront them with the meaning of discipleship and Christian stewardship.

Stop Signs and Traffic Lights

"I am the way and the truth and the life" John 14:6

Are you ready for our Journey with Jesus? Every journey starts with packing the essentials. On this trip all you will need is a bible, a good devotional and an appetite for adventure.

With any journey comes some apprehension of the unknown. "My bible is dusty" or "I don't know of a good devotional". Let us help. Suggestions and tools will be provided to help ease those travel worries.

Our journey begins with encountering the many signals and signs on this superhighway of life. Stop signs tell us to stop at an intersection, look at what direction to take and then proceed. Consider this when you come to *stop sign* in your life. Which direction are you heading in your spiritual journey? Are you choosing the path of the evil one, or are you traveling on the path of Jesus, the way?

Traffic lights let us know when it is time to stop, when it is time to slow down and when it is time to go forward. Envision yourself at a stop light in your neighborhood and consider this: Stop (red light)— Stop and listen to God. What is He trying to tell you?

Job 37:14, John 5:14-15, Jeremiah 29:13, 1John 2:16-17

Slow (yellow light) – Slow down and make time for God.

2Peter 3:9, Proverbs 8:34, John 15:16-17, 2Peter 3:18, 1Peter 2:2-3

Go (green light) – Go God's way every day.

2Timothy 1:8-10, 1Peter 3:8-11, Matthew 5:14-16, Luke 11:33, 1Peter 3:15

Stop: Listen to what God is putting in your heart today?

Talk to God and ask for strength or simply thank Him for this great day? Then dust off your bibles. If you don't have one, find a version you are comfortable reading, (NIV, Good News Translation, Contemporary English Version, King James, etc). Look up the above scripture readings. What is God saying to you in these readings?

Slow: How are you spending time with God.

Find a devotion that speaks to you and/or your family. Then choose a time daily to read and reflect. Did God speak to you in that devotion today? Here are a few suggested devotionals: "You Version" Bible app or other Apps on your phone (for you techies), "Christ in Our Home", "Jesus Calling", "Portals of Prayer" or "Little Visits with Jesus".

Go: How are you sharing what God has put in your heart today.

Share with someone what God has done for you to a family member, friend or others. Attending church and/or group bible study also solidifies a community of sharing the word.

Groundwork Guatemala News



Please meet Sandra Yessenia Sicaja Tipaz.

Sandra began her mission work at the young age of 15 years old. Originally with the mission that preceded Groundwork, A Servants Heart, Sandra continued and has been with Groundwork Guatemala since its beginning in 2009. At the age of 32, that amounts to 17 years of being a missionary. What dedication.

Sandra's family has not had an easy life. Her parents met in the dump while working and fell in love. Her Mother came to that area when her Mother, Sandra's grandmother, moved her family from a remote Mayan village to Guatemala City near the dump. Her hope was to have of a better life.

Sandra's Mom, Petrona or Tona for short, has been the driving force behind raising 8 children, most of which are professionals. She had Sandra when she was only 15 years old. Sandra, who is single with no children, has 7 siblings, 5 sisters and 2 brothers.

Sandra's Father was in the military and believed that girls do not go to school. Her Mother heard of a mission that would help pay for schooling for her girls and that is how Sandra got her start as a missionary. She began as an accountant at A Servants Heart. Sandra's sister, Aracely was a teacher and is now working with Groundwork. Her sisters Ingrid and Iris are in accounting. The youngest girl, Leidy is 18 and in 9th grade. If you were to meet Sandra you would soon come to love her contagious smile and bubbly personality. When I first met her, she was beginning her study of the English language. On our trips into the communities, she would sit next to me and ask all sorts of questions, not only get to know me, but also work on her English. She always asks for prayers for her English.

Sandra seeks daily to improve her relationship with God. Her belief is that with God you have everything. She told us that you need to find a way to serve God in whatever job you do. Her favorite saying I looked forward to hearing every morning when asked "How are you today?" was simply "Blessed by the Lord". When you tried to give her a compliment she would just say, "Thanks be to God". She truly believes that everything comes from God. She is such a humble and faithful servant. It is her love of God and others that continues to inspire me. My sponsorship of her is a blessing that I get to see daily in her work and in her life. Sandra's work gives her the privilege to minister one on one to many people. Sometimes in extreme situations, such as near death, she sees people with a hunger for God. She sees this as an opportunity to prepare those for meeting God. Her goal is also to help people's spiritual life no matter what is wrong in everyday life.

She also works with the scholarship children. Her goal is to help them to understand that this educational opportunity is a blessing from God and it should not be wasted.

Her favorite activities outside of Groundwork are working at her church and helping with bible studies and devotions. Her Mother is her inspiration and she also tries to spend time with her as well.

She asks that you please pray for her Dad so that she can have a better relationship with him and to help her forgive him for the past.

My favorite quote from Sandra:

"In the same way that God loves me, I must love and forgive, trust, tolerate, endure, be benevolent, patient, merciful, kind, full of grace, faithful, not disrespecting people, no matter how often they fail. It is to love without limit in body, soul and spirit. For the love of God is like the sea. It has no limits, or like the immense sky. With the help of God we can do it little by little and day after day.
