

Groundwork Guatemala News



One of the things we love the most when we visit Groundwork Guatemala is working with the local Guatemalan missionaries. Over the next several months, we will share their stories, beginning with Nancy Gottschalk telling you "All About Oscar."

Oscar is a 35 year-old native Guatemalan missionary. He leads the Children's Faith Lessons in the various villages we visit.

Oscar was born in a rural Guatemalan village, one of nine children. He has seven sisters and one brother. When he was 6 years old, his mother moved the family to Guatemala City to escape an abusive father. They settled in an area called La Libertad, a poor neighborhood built on an older foundation of the city dump. His mother cleaned houses to support the family, but food and money was always in short supply. By the time he was seven, Oscar would go down into the dump alone to search the garbage for food for his family. He would also go with his mom and sister to search for wood that they could use or sell. To this day, Oscar supports his mother and sisters.

While in the dump, he was attracted to guitar music being played by a Christian group that also presented a faith lesson. This led to him becoming a committed Christian by the time he was thirteen. He began working at a Christian organization called Servant's Heart (mostly because he would get oranges there), and eventually he began planning faith lessons for the teachers. He met Kevin and Ginny Holmes there, and when Servant's Heart closed, he went with them when they founded Groundwork Guatemala. Oscar thought about other jobs, but says that he loves working with the children too much to leave them.

Each morning, Oscar walks or takes a "Chicken Bus" to the mission house. He helps the American teams by translating, leading the praise worship, and making sure our lessons run smoothly. On alternate weeks, when there is no American team at Groundwork, Oscar single-handedly plans the Faith Lesson and an associated craft for over 550 kids.

One of Oscar's favorite Bible verses is Proverbs 3:5: Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding.

Another favorite comes from Psalm 37, when it talks about trusting the Lord, committing his way to the Lord, and waiting for the Lord to act.

Outside of work, Oscar likes to swim. He enjoys history and action movies and mentions "I Can Only Imagine" as a favorite. He likes the band Mercy Me, as well as classical music. He enjoys shopping local markets for items to resell. Time with family and friends is very important to him. Favorite foods are shrimp and pizza.

Oscar is a dedicated servant of God, and a natural leader of the children. We call him the Pied Piper of Kids. It is a blessing to know and work with Oscar.

A special thank you goes out to Miss Jackson for guiding our kids through this process.

Other activities involve athletics. Our winter athletic program is in full swing. We have four basketball teams that practice twice a week; play in league games, and tournaments. In January, our Short Shots basketball program begins. It is a joy to see our younger students learn and grow in the area of teamwork.

Now, the "Thank You's". I want to thank you for participating in the annual Cookie Walk our PTL holds in December. We raised \$2500.00 to help address some building security issues at St. Paul's. Thank you for purchasing, baking, and eating our cookies. It was a great success, and we look forward to putting it on again next year. Thank you for your donations.

We have the joy to know that we will one day be reunited with our departed loved ones again in heaven because of what Jesus did for all of us. I thank God for this, and I thank you for donating to our school assistance program in memory and honor of those loved ones who died. All of the money donated is given to needy families so they are able to afford a Christian education. With the way the economy is, more and more families need financial assistance. Because of your thoughtfulness and generosity, we are able to provide that help to those families. Thank you for thinking of this program at St. Paul's Lutheran School, and I pray that you continue to keep this program in mind as a memorial in the future.

Thank you for your support. St. Paul's Lutheran Church has supported its school for a very long time. I want to thank you for the many ways that this was, is and will be done. It is a joy to share the Gospel message with our students and their families at the school. I pray God continues to bless our efforts and continues to move you to support our school even more.

We have to be intentional about remembering it's Christmas. Where we are in Asia, and in most places "over here," Christmas is almost a non-event. There's no snow (except on the mountains). Our streets are not decorated. We don't see Christmas commercials. In fact, in our home of Taiwan, Christmas isn't even a day off: people still have to work, and students still go to school. They only know it as a commercial event.

That's part of the reason we are living and working out here, and a great reminder of why YOU and WE are working together "All Over Asia." Christians may gather for worship at church on Christmas Day morning. Then they celebrate at home with a special Christmas meal, which may be one of the few times of the year that they eat meat.

As Christians, we know that the true reason for these celebrations is because of the birth of our Savior, Jesus. I am very thankful that the students at Hope Lutheran Church and School in Bufuula had opportunities to hear this message during church, chapel, and Sunday School lessons.
