AS WE GATHER

Today, our Lord provides three more parables about the Kingdom of God. As people finding hidden, priceless treasure or a valuable pearl might sell other possessions for these, so the Kingdom (really, Jesus Himself) is worth more than all that we have. Like last Sunday's parables, Jesus' third parable is about the Last Day, providing urgency for being in the Kingdom now. In His great love, Moses reminded the people before they entered the Promised Land that God had chosen them (and now us) as His people. With His protection and defense, Paul affirms nothing "will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

OLD TESTAMENT READING *Deuteronomy 7:6–9* (God chooses His people out of love.) For you are a people holy to the Lord your God. The Lord your God has chosen you out of all the peoples on the face of the earth to be his people, his treasured possession. The Lord did not set his affection on you and choose you because you were more numerous than other peoples, for you were the fewest of all peoples. But it was because the Lord loved you and kept the oath he swore to your forefathers that he brought you out with a mighty hand and redeemed you from the land of slavery, from the power of Pharaoh king of Egypt. Know therefore that the Lord your God is God; he is the faithful God, keeping his covenant of love to a thousand generations of those who love him and keep his commands.

EPISTLE Romans 8:28–39 (For those who love God, all things work together for good.) And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the likeness of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brothers. And those he predestined, he also called; those he called, he also justified; those he justified, he also glorified. What, then, shall we say in response to this? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all - how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. Who is he that condemns? Christ Jesus, who died - more than that, who was raised to life - is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? As it is written: "For your sake we face death all day long; we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered."
