**CATECHISM** *Small Catechism: Table of Duties; Ephesians 6:4; Ephesians 6:1–3*

Pastor: In his Small Catechism, Dr. Martin Luther included the Table of Duties, which has Bible verses that relate to specific vocations. Using Scripture, he wrote concerning duties of parents and children. To parents, Luther quoted:

**People: Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.**

Pastor: To children, Luther quoted:

**People: Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. "Honor your father and mother" (this is the first commandment with a promise), "that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land."**

**CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION**

Pastor: Father in heaven, you have called us to "bring children up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord," a task that we have not always fulfilled as parents and as a congregation. You have called us to honor our father and mother, yet we have not always showed our parents and other authorities love and respect. In these and other ways, we have sinned in thought, word, and deed, and we cannot free ourselves from our sinful condition. Together as your people, we take refuge in your infinite mercy, seeking your grace for the sake of Christ, and saying: God, be merciful to me, a sinner.

**People: Almighty God, have mercy upon us, forgive us our sins, and lead us to everlasting life. Amen.**

Pastor: Upon this, your confession, I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God to all of you, and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

**OLD TESTAMENT READING** *Deuteronomy 6:4–9* (Teach His commands to  
your children.) “Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. You shall love  
the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might.  
And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach  
them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house,  
and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. You  
shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your  
eyes. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

**EPISTLE** *Ephesians 5:25–27* (Husbands, love your wives.) Husbands, love your  
wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, that he might sanctify  
her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, so that he might

**HOLY GOSPEL** *Luke 11:1-13*

Now Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he finished, one of his disciples  
said to him, “Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples.” And he said to  
them, “When you pray, say: “Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come.  
Give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive  
everyone who is indebted to us. And lead us not into temptation.” And he said to  
them, “Which of you who has a friend will go to him at midnight and say to him,  
‘Friend, lend me three loaves, for a friend of mine has arrived on a journey, and I  
have nothing to set before him’; and he will answer from within, ‘Do not bother me;  
the door is now shut, and my children are with me in bed. I cannot get up and give  
you anything’? I tell you, though he will not get up and give him anything because he  
is his friend, yet because of his impudence he will rise and give him whatever he  
needs. And I tell you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock,  
and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks  
finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened. What father among you, if his  
son asks for a fish, will instead of a fish give him a serpent; or if he asks for an egg,  
will give him a scorpion? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to  
your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those  
who ask him!”
