


From your Pastor.....

*“Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation, now that you have tasted that the Lord is good.” 1 Peter 2:2*



I’ve been on a fairly strict self-imposed diet for a month. I can tell you one thing about me and diets. *I think about food a lot.* It always seems that the TV commercials about my favorite restaurants increase in number and intensity when I’m trying to lose weight. *The sight of that chunk of lobster on a fork being dipped in butter can now bring me to tears.* But I’m determined, as God enables me, to have you see less of me in the future.

This past weekend, Pastor Bender shared with us the story of Ramon in Guatemala. He was the 99 year old gentleman visited by the team and whose health was in decline. He subsisted each day on a tortilla and some fruit. Not much. You’ll remember that Ramon said, “That’s enough about food for the body – I want some food for the spirit.” The Word! Oh that we would crave the Word with the same hunger! Note that the above Bible passage talks about **spiritual milk** and **growing up**.

As Christians, we are called to grow in the Word. First comes the milk; the Gospel that brings us to faith by the power of the Holy Spirit. It is vital to our salvation and it is always, always necessary throughout our lives. And then comes the solid food: Again the Word as we grow in the wisdom and knowledge of God’s will for our lives. Christian growth is not measured in the number of Bible verses we know by heart or a detailed knowledge of every page of Holy Scripture. It is found when we abandon our own strength and come to an ever increasing dependence upon God in all things. It is in the Spirit-driven desire to live out Christ in our lives. Faith in Christ at the center, service to Christ in our thoughts and hearts. The worldly cravings of this life are replaced with craving for spiritual food – like Ramon.



**As we begin to think about confirmations and graduations, it’s important to be reminded that growth in the Word is a lifelong process.**

Bible study, personal and family devotions, worship, Word and Sacrament – a table set with a heavenly banquet in this life, a foretaste of the Feast to come!

## FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

**REPORT ON THE CROSS** This sounds like a sermon title, but it's not! The stone atop the East end on the sanctuary roofline has been removed (You'll recall that it was illuminated at night with red neon). Earlier this year cracks were discovered at the base. Holton Brothers Masonry of Grafton inspected the cross and deemed that it was unstable and unsafe and needed to be removed. In the process it literally came apart – held together only by a small metal band that served to hold the neon tube assembly in place. We praise God that it did not fall! Upon close inspection it's apparent that the metal rod that "pinned" the cross atop its base had corroded, expanding in the process, and split the stone. We're exploring different options for a replacement.

## Whom Are You Looking At?

The disciples were thrilled. They had their Lord back in their presence once again. Since his resurrection, he had appeared to them and others several times. They were still a little confused, though, when he talked about "wait[ing] for the gift [his] Father promised" (Acts 1:4), and, then, "He was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight" (Acts 1:9).

You can imagine their bewilderment. He had died and been buried and then had risen from the dead! He had walked among them and taught them again, and now he is taken up into the clouds. No wonder they stood ... probably with mouths agape ... looking into the sky where they had last seen him.

It took "two men dressed in white" (Acts 1:10) to bring them back to their senses. "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into Heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into Heaven" (Acts 1:11).

Back they went to Jerusalem. Their eyes were no longer on the clouds, but they were still looking at Jesus. They waited. They prayed. They chose another disciple. And they waited some more ... all the while looking at Jesus.

Whom are you looking at? Yes, Jesus had ascended. We can only imagine his joyful triumphant return as all the hosts of Heaven welcomed back the risen victorious Savior. Because he is that Savior, because he is the "author and perfecter of our faith," "let us fix our eyes on Jesus" (Hebrews 12:2). Though his Word and Sacraments, he will lead us in his ways; he will teach us obedience and self-sacrifice; he will teach us love for our neighbors. With joyful and generous hearts, we celebrate the new life that Easter brings us by sharing the message of the Cross and the Empty Tomb with all who listen. Keep looking at Jesus until in Heaven you see him face to face!

*God comes first, not last. Otherwise, we give him only the leftovers after we have made sure that we have provided for our own comforts.*

*The principle of sacrificial giving is that our giving to God comes off the top of all that he has given us. Otherwise, some would say it is not a true offering, just a tip left at the table. Pray to be enabled to give generously.*


### Selamat Paskah! (Indonesian for “Happy Easter”)

Alleluia, Christ is risen! *He is risen indeed, Alleluia!*

March 2016 gave us some opportunities to reinforce and expand relationships with people already in our lives, and to start building some new ones. Through it all, we had the restrained joy of Lent and its disciplines, looking forward to the overwhelming joy of Easter. As we sometimes get overwhelmed with the enormity of the tasks before us, Easter sets things back in place, and reminds us of the overall truth: Christ has died, Christ has risen, and Christ will come again. Everything else is put in its proper place by this proclamation.



One of the joys of this past month was the chance to spend some quality time with the Bishop of our friends in Indonesia, the Indonesian Christian Lutheran Church (GKLI). Bishop Aladin and his wife invited us to their home on the outskirts of Medan. What an honor, to spend time with them there. And what a meal! We had great food, wonderful conversation, and there was much laughter and joy to be with such faithful Lutheran Christians. Cheryl even got honored by getting draped with an *ulos* and thereby welcomed into the Bishop’s family. They’ve been incredible blessings to us, especially as we’ve gotten settled in our Medan home. Being closer to them was one of the reasons we moved to Medan, and it’s turned out even better than we’d hoped.



We’ve settled into our new neighborhood a little more in the last month, and word is certainly getting around that there are foreigners living nearby. We still draw many strange and curious looks, for this part of Medan is not known for residents like us. But Cheryl’s embraced it wholeheartedly, going to the local market for much of our grocery shopping and talking to the shopkeepers in *Bahasa Indonesia*. She and the kids have found a park nearby with play equipment, which gives the kids a good chance to meet their peers. We even have a local school about a block away, and the students come by the house nearly every day to see our kids, practice their English, and generally look curiously at our family.

The highlight for us in March was of course the celebration of Holy Week and Easter. We had a Palm Sunday Procession which started in front of our house, with our own kids choir waving palm branches freshly plucked from the tree across the street. There were several of our neighbors who looked very curiously at us! I was able to provide Maundy Thursday and Good Friday Services for the small group in Singapore, which they wouldn’t have had otherwise. Then on Saturday we celebrated the Vigil of Easter, and the Resurrection of Our Lord on Sunday.



We are **thankful** for your continued interest in the work we’re doing together in SE Asia. We are **comforted** by knowing we’re connected to you in our Lord’s Church. We are **joyful** in the victory of our Lord Jesus Christ over sin, death, and the devil! ✠
