It is time to ask God to "teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom" (*Psalm 90:12*).

OLD TESTAMENT READING *Isaiah* 30:15–17 (Sometimes God's people do not rely on His promise of salvation.) For thus said the Lord God, the Holy One of Israel, "In returning and rest you shall be saved; in quietness and in trust shall be your strength."But you were unwilling, and you said, "No! We will flee upon horses"; therefore you shall flee away; and, "We will ride upon swift steeds"; therefore your pursuers shall be swift. A thousand shall flee at the threat of one; at the threat of five you shall flee, till you are left like a flagstaff on the top of a mountain, like a signal on a hill.

Lector: This is the Word of the Lord. **People: How then shall we be saved?**

Lector: God's answer is in the Epistle reading.

EPISTLE *Romans* 8:31b–39 (We are more than conquerors, no matter what opposition may arise.)

Lector: If God is for us, who can be against us?

People: He who did not spare His own Son but gave Him up for us all, how will He not also with Him graciously give us all things?

Lector: Who shall bring any charge against God's elect?

People: It is God who justifies.

Lector: Who is to condemn?

People: Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us.

Lector: Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? As it is written, "For Your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered."

People: No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Lector: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God, we can live confident lives in Christ!

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the twelfth chapter.

People: Glory to you, O Lord.

HOLY GOSPEL *Luke 12:35–40* (Jesus exhorts vigilance every day.)

"Stay dressed for action and keep your lamps burning, and be like men who are waiting for their master to come home from the wedding feast, so that they may open the door to him at once when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds awake when he comes. Truly, I say to you, he will dress himself for service and have them recline at table, and he will come and serve them. If he comes in the second watch, or in the third, and finds them awake, blessed are those servants! But know this, that if the master of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have left his house to be broken into. You also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect."
