AS WE GATHER

The Last Sunday of the Church Year has also been called "Christ the King Sunday." But as we look at today's Holy Gospel, Jesus doesn't seem very regal or royal from the cross. Pilate mocks Jesus with the inscription "This is the King of the Jews." Jesus hangs and dies beaten, bruised, and bloody. Yet, Jesus is King—even from the cross. Going to the cross, Jesus is remarkably in control, warning the daughters of Jerusalem, praying, "Father, forgive them," and extending salvation to the repentant thief. That thief must have taken notice of Jesus' kingship because he pleads, "Remember me when You come into Your kingdom" (Luke 23:42). And so we pray: Crucified King Jesus, remember us, and keep us in the faith until You return to reign.
