FROM THE PASTOR...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

For the past month, before our service begins, we have been speaking a Bible verse. It declares that our God is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to *His power that is at work in us.* More than just a verse to recite or memorize, this is a bold word of promise from our God. It is a word that calls us to believe! The word translated "power" in that verse is the Greek word, *dunamis*. It is the same root of the word "dynamite." God's power, His holy "dynamite" is at work *in us!*

We have work to do in the name of Jesus. Sometimes we grow weary. Sometimes we doubt. Sometimes we become apathetic and say, "let someone else do the work." Yet, God's Spirit desires to pump us up for work in Christ Jesus, pumped up even more than when we root for our favorite team. Our Lord equips us, inspires us, and moves us to action for Christ and for all people.

The prophet Isaiah penned: "Those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint." (Isaiah 40:31, NIV) Based on this truth of the living God, we have begun a campaign called: "Renewed in Christ: Hope • Strength • Soar"

To be sure, we have a hope in Christ that wells up to life eternal. Yet, what are your hopes for the mission of Christ here at St. Paul's? Do we want more to be saved, more students to be blessed by a St. Paul's education, more people involved in serving our Lord? Will the Lord give us the strength and resources to accomplish His will? Will St. Paul's soar on wings like an eagle through being carried along by the Spirit of the Living God? I hope you answer all of the questions with a resounding "Yes."

I hope you, too, want to be involved in praying, serving, and sacrificially giving to the work of our Lord. And I hope you want to learn more. Plan to be in worship on the weekend of October 17-18 and also to participate in our "Inform" presentation on October 18 at 9:15am in the gymnasium. All adults are welcome! If you are coming, why not bring a friend. All will be blessed by the truth of God's Word.




Renewed in Christ Hope • Strength • Soar



Dr. John Behnke, the guest organist/director, will be accompanied by the Milwaukee Handbell Ensemble. Free admission. A light supper will follow the program.

Reformation 500 Series Event – John Warwick Montgomery, noted lawyer, prolific author and Lutheran theologian, will give a Reformation 500 presentation Tuesday, October 13th at 7 pm in Concordia University Wisconsin's Terrace Room entitled.

"Luther on Scripture: Why He Would Have a Fit 500 Years Later." He will give an encore presentation the following day at noon. Montgomery, 83, is a distinguished, research professor of philosophy at Concordia University Wisconsin and continues to specialize in religious freedom cases in international Human Rights law. A scholarly maverick, he has 11 earned degrees in multiple disciplines and is the author of more than 235 works. The October 13th and 14th presentations, part of a series of spring and fall lectures leading up to a celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation in October, 2017, are free and open to the public.

Living for Jesus

German Theologian Martin Luther said, "If someone would knock on my heart and ask, 'Who lives here?' I would say, 'Martin Luther once lived here, but he has moved out and Jesus has moved in.' " In Galatians 2:20 the apostle Paul wrote that he, too, lived for Jesus. "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God."

Who or what do you live for? If we live for ourselves and the things of the world, we will focus our attention and energy on amassing more and more things. It is easy for money and possessions to become overly important because our society tells us that more is better and that happiness and success can only be achieved by having the newest and best things. To find happiness and success, we work long and hard.

King Solomon, who was wealthy and wise, tried almost everything and found no satisfaction with things of the world. In Ecclesiastes, he tells us that he tried wine and women; he built houses, gardens, and parks; he bought slaves, herds and flocks, and amassed silver and gold. "I denied myself nothing my eyes desired; I refused my heart no pleasure . . . Yet when I surveyed all that my hands had done and what I had toiled to achieve, everything was meaningless, a chasing after the wind; nothing was gained under the sun." (Ecclesiastes 2:10-11). Regarding money, Solomon wrote, "Whoever loves money never has money enough; whoever loves wealth is never satisfied with his income. This too is meaningless" (vs. 5:10).

In closing the book of Ecclesiastes, Solomon wrote, "Now all has been heard; here is the conclusion of the matter: Fear God and keep his commandments, for this the whole duty of man. For God will bring every deed into judgment . . . " (Ecclesiastes 12:13-14). The only thing that finally gave Solomon's life purpose was living for God. Likewise, we as Christians understand that Jesus is the only person who can give us lasting peace, comfort, and security. He alone meets our needs. Jesus' tremendous sacrifice showed us his love for us and his love compels us to love him and live for him. Filled with Jesus' presence in our lives, we are empowered to overcome the pull of the world.

Christian Stewards do not dedicate their time, their talent, or their treasure so that they may become God's, but because they are God's.




This month wasn't always easy, especially since we spent at least half of it separated. But it was wildly fruitful, for which we give thanks to God who sustains us and grants His gracious blessing.

I left right away on the 1st, headed for Singapore to deliver Word and Sacrament ministry. Then it was on to North Sumatra to meet up with Rev. Brent Kuhlman and Dcs. Dr. Cynthia Lumley who were coming to teach at a set of theological conferences we had been planning for months. Our friends in the

Indonesian Christian Lutheran Church (GKLI) had asked for these conferences to train their church leaders in Scriptural Lutheran beliefs regarding the Office of the Ministry and the service of women in the church.

Pastor Kuhlman, Dr. Lumley, and I spent two weeks presenting at workshops in Medan and Tarutung, meeting with church leaders, and building relationships between our churches. The workshops were well-received, and generated some incredibly helpful discussion as people struggled with what it means to be faithful to the way our Lord has ordered His creation and His church. There was great emphasis on the Lutheran understanding of *vocation*, and many people seemed to greatly appreciate what they were taught.

Bishop Aladin of the GKLI was very happy to have the assistance of the LCMS in presenting on these topics, and was an incredible host during our time together. He even took us to the Nommensen memorial in Tarutung, commemorating the German Lutheran pastor in the 1800's who brought the Gospel to the Batak people (picture at right).



In both places, the people of the GKLI kept asking for one thing: **more** of these opportunities to learn and grow. They are truly hungry to study the Scriptures and the Confessions, and were the most attentive group I've seen anywhere.

They were fully engaged, and asked lots of clarifying questions.



Our partners in Indonesia need this kind of education, and we in the LCMS are uniquely positioned to provide it. But we're only able to do so because of the support you are giving to the Ferry Family and to the LCMS. Thank you for allowing us this chance to help our brothers and sisters grow in their knowledge and faith.




